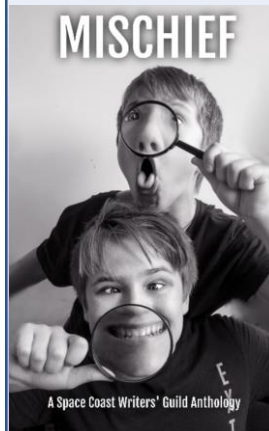
Guest Speaker: Julie Bernard

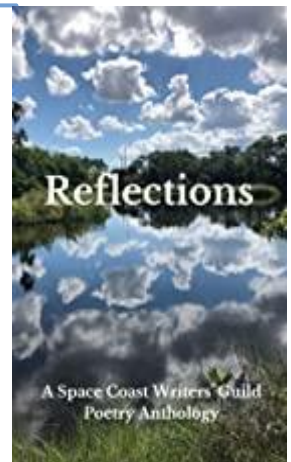

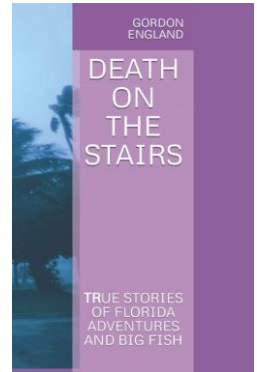
